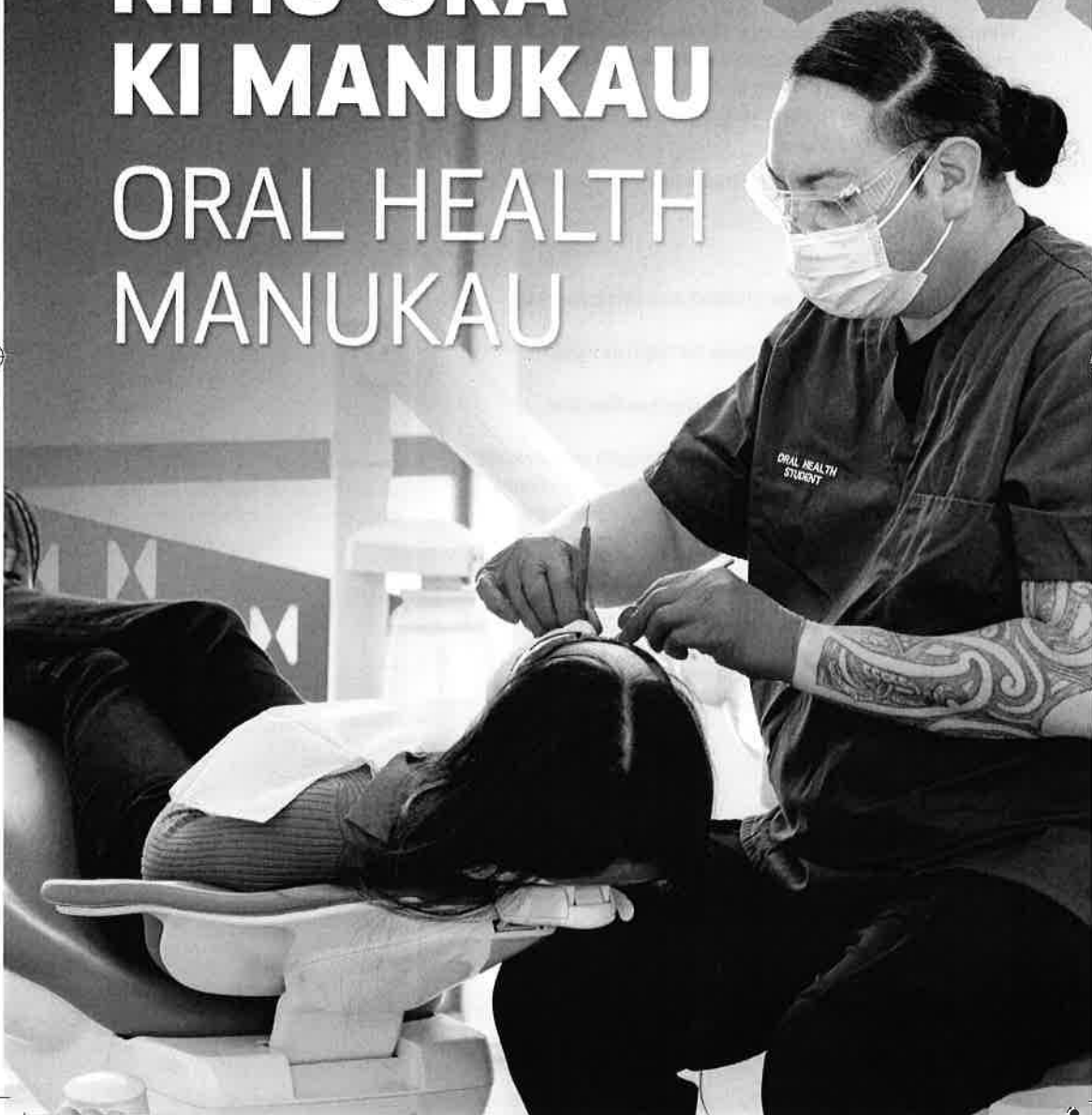

Niho Ora ki Manukau offers a range of oral health services, including assessment, diagnosis, management, treatment and prevention. Our focus is on addressing dental conditions in children and periodontal issues in adults. We also prioritise health education and promotion to ensure oral health is integrated into overall wellbeing.

Niho Ora ki Manukau operates as a teaching clinic. AUT oral health students enrolled in the Bachelor of Health Science (Oral Health) provide oral health care, supervised by experienced and registered oral health practitioners, at a reduced cost.

As this is a student clinic, your treatment may take more than one appointment.

Our services include:

- Free dental treatment for children and adolescents up until age 18
- Free preventive oral health care for hapū (pregnant) māmā
- Periodontal disease (gum disease) prevention and treatment
- Comprehensive examination and oral health assessments
- Dental radiographs to assess teeth and bone conditions
- Scaling of teeth to remove plaque and calculus (hard plaque deposits)
- Mouthguards
